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**COMMISSIONER JONATHAN S. FUHRMAN HAS BEEN  
ELECTED TO HIS FIRST TERM AS  
CO-CHAIRMAN OF THE  
LOS ANGELES COUNTY  
CITIZENS' ECONOMY AND EFFICIENCY COMMISSION**

At its February 2014 meeting, the Los Angeles County Citizens' Economy and Efficiency Commission recognized the contributions of Jonathan S. Fuhrman to the Commission by electing him to his first term as Co-Chairman.

Mr. Fuhrman, an appointee to the Commission of Supervisor Gloria Molina, currently is retired. He was the former Manager of Application Development at Employers Insurance Group. Mr. Fuhrman is also the current Chair of the Los Angeles County Information Systems Commission. Mr. Fuhrman currently serves as Treasurer for the Pasadena Educational Foundation and for the Pasadena Community College Foundation, is a board member of the Mother's Club, and is member of ACT (a grass-roots political action group) and the League of Women Voters-Pasadena. He also chairs the Citizens Oversight Committee for the Pasadena Unified School District's Measure TT bond funds.

In accepting his election as chair, Mr. Fuhrman recognized the contributions that have been made by the Commission throughout the years and remarked, "I am deeply honored that my fellow Commissioners have elected me as Co-Chair. I believe our Commission has made important contributions to improving how County government functions, and I hope to help extend that remarkable record of achievement."

The Economy and Efficiency Commission has twenty-one members. Each of the five members of the Board of Supervisors appoints four commissioners to the Commission for a two-year term which may be extended by reappointment. The previous year's Grand Jury Foreperson is appointed by the Board as the Commission's 21st member. Created in 1964, the Commission is charged with reviewing all aspects of local government management, operations and policies. It submits recommendations directly to the Board of Supervisors with the objective of improving the economy, efficiency and effectiveness of local government. The members of the Commission offer their time to the County on a voluntary basis and serve without pay.
